

Dear Church,

I don't know about you, but I love summer. I love the longer days. I love the kids running around playing. I love the break from school so kids can just be kids. I love letting the sun shine down on my face. I love worshipping outside. I love watching cars stop to listen on the street mid-sermon during outdoor worship. I love hiking and exploring in the summer. I love the camps and the mission trips and the activity that becomes possible during school break. I love watching the most amazing athletes compete in the summer Olympics. And I get a little sad when August hits because it means summer is only with us for another month, but when that sadness kicks in, I remind myself to be in the present. To enjoy right now. And I think it was Simone Biles who recently said that she wishes people would stop asking Olympic athletes, "What's next?" Because they need time to enjoy the moment they're in—the moment they've dreamed of.

Sometimes we need to remember to enjoy the "right now". Instead of rushing past something, we need to pause and enjoy the moments of joy. During outdoor worship a couple weeks ago, we had multiple people in awe of a butterfly flying around during the service. I didn't see the butterfly (other than videos and pictures) but I love that the butterfly was able to capture people's attention and give them a moment of awe right in the middle of worship, because that's part of experiencing the glory of God. God wants to capture our attention and leave us in awe. God wants to capture our attention and make us pause and live in the moment. God wants us to pause.

So I hope you can take time to pause this summer. I hope you can take a moment to let in the glory of God. Because it's in those moments of pause - those moments of awe - when we can feel the presence of the Holy Spirit in our lives.

And as we think about these moments, I want to share a couple additional things with you:

- 1. We sent a total of 58 people to Detroit for the 2024 WAY mission trip, 18 from Zion. I'll put pictures throughout this short edition of the Zionite for you to see them at work. They worked with a group called LifeBuilders Detroit, and a food pantry sorting location called Forgotten Harvest. They worked hard and they were a blessing to the community!
- 2. Plymouth Crossroads found a new home, with over an acre of land, so we were able to purchase a new riding lawn mower for them (with the help of our church members). Please continue to pray for them at Plymouth Crossroads, they are the home for homeless teen boys started by the United Church Home Society.
- 3. We had our listening workshop this past Sunday after church. It was a great way to get to know people on a deeper level. AnnMarie Hartmans said, "Dirck and I truly enjoyed the listening exercise last Sunday. I would recommend it to anyone in the church who would like to learn about members and themselves, we even made new friends! Very good for new members in particular." We will hold another listening event in the winter, and we hope even more people will attend!





Approval of Consistory Meeting Minutes: Motioned for approval by Dave and seconded by Bob. All

Kalee's Member in Discernment (MID):

- · Committee Meeting held this week; Kalee shared her portfolio, school updates
- She is leaning towards pastoring 1 day/week
- She and Annmarie will be going on a trip soon
- After such time she will start working on her thesis (which must be completed by February)
- Working her way towards ordination
- She continues working with Hospice; days are hard and long; doing walking & yoga to help keep her centered

Kalee's Pastoral Care Team Updates:

• Retreat coming up July 14th; she and Annmarie will record a video from the retreat location

Pastor's Report:

- We are still looking for 5 volunteers for the Community Missions ministry. Pastor will continue to spread the word for this. If anyone is interested, let her know.
- Summer Worship begins June 23rd. Worship will be at 9:30am during the summer. When it is a contemporary Sunday and weather permits, we will worship outdoors.
- Summer schedule: Pastor will be in the office as she regularly is, however, she might have to leave temporarily to drive kids from one place to the other, so it's always safest to call/text before coming in to see her. She will be in Massachusetts June 24-28 (Monday-Friday) to visit with family. She'll still be available by phone and she'll return Friday night in time for the Strawberry Festival. She'll be away the week of July 8th for the mission trip in Detroit. Kalee will preach on July 14. From Detroit, Taylor and Pastor are flying to Colorado to see family. They'll return home that Saturday, so she will be preaching on July 21st. Trevor and Pastor are hoping to plan a trip away without the kids for their 15th anniversary on August 22nd, so she might be away for the end of that week (though not the beginning so she'll be at VBS for at least the first part of the week).
- August 4th is our Listening Lunch and event; she hopes everyone plans to stay after worship!

- Carpet/Paint Refresh in Narthex (donor paid for new carpeting install 6/18)
- DCC Sponsorship we have 3 first timers & 3 returners



- Trustees walked grounds envisioning of next projects (i.e., sidewalks, ADA compliance, Courtyard, entrance way, etc.)
- Likely in future, they will host an envisioning night for all

- o Men's Fellowship is renting a Dunk Tank from ABC Rental
- We are going to have challenges with refrigerator & freezer space
 - A member graciously offered to purchase a new chest freezer; this is in same room as existing freezer and Ed Miller confirmed that our electricity can support it
 - One of the signups is to have people bring in coolers on Friday night before the event
- George has graciously offered for us to use his 10' x 20' tent in the courtyard area for the band
- We still have quite a few volunteer positions to fill for the event
- Upcoming future events include Meat Raffle & Rummage Sale (dates tbd)

- Pastor will have a follow-up conversation with Jeff about this

- There were some issues with the large coffee urn so we'll be switching to a smaller capacity unit
