

Zion UCC Consistory Meeting Minutes 08.14.2024

Call to Order: 7:01pm by Edie Bauer

Members present: Pastor Elizabeth, Elena Camp, W. George Darrall, Robin Fowler, Kalee Mielke, Pierre Albrecht-Carrie, Dave Dombrowski, Bob Sedota, Edie Bauer, John Pauling, Debby Williams and Ted Camp (Trustees)

Devotion and Lord's Prayer: Pastor Elizabeth

Approval of Consistory Meeting Minutes: Motioned for approval was made by Debby and seconded by Elena. All attending members approved.

Treasurer's Report:

•As of 8/2/2024 there is a balance of \$52,956.13 in the operating account and \$8,645.67 in the restricted funds account. The operating account balance takes into consideration the payroll for 8/9/24.

•The revenue for July was \$20,459.95. The net income was \$9268.54 In comparison: The revenue for July 2023 was \$16,269.06. The net income for July 2023 was \$3,604.37. The YTD income for 2024 is \$122,653.76 and the net income is \$10,354.20. The 2023 YTD was \$116,238.44 and the net income was \$3090.27.

Kalee's Member in Discernment (MID):

•As of September 1st, Kalee will be starting PT as Pastor of the First Congregational Church in Niagara Falls and PT as Chaplain at Hospice Niagara.

- She is still a member here at Zion and will be here for Consistory and for other events.
- •September 25, she will be preaching at St. Paul's on Shawnee Road

•Kalee's Pastoral Care Team Updates: will be meeting September 4 and have a session on how the teachings are going

Approve adding Marcel to Trustees

•Discussion about waiving the two year requirement since marcel has been participating in church activities and worship for fourteen years.

•It was decided that Consistory would conditionally approve this with the final approval to be made at the annual congregational meeting. Pierre made a motion to approve, and John seconded. All attending were approved unanimously.

•A proposal was made to possibly reword the bylaw- will think of how Consistory wants it worded and will vote and discuss it more next month.

•It was recommended to review proposals in regards to language for membership to be on one of the Zion's boards in the future.

Pastor's Report:

• Pastor will be away August 22-27 for Trevor and her anniversary. Kalee will be on call and Pastor Elizabeth's mom will preach that Sunday.

• November 17 will be Stewardship Sunday and lay preacher, Angie Staniszewski, will be preaching on the importance of Stewardship.

• Rally Day is September 8 with 10am worship followed by lunch and festivities. This is the kickoff to Sunday school.

• Two services resume Sept 15. 9 & 10:45am.

• We're looking forward to a great week of VBS! So far, we have 20 children registered and some youth volunteers planning to help.

Trustee's Report (Ted):

- Thank you to Laurie M and team who painted the Narthex and had new carpeting placed.
- Working on Vision plan for future projects
- Environmental committee has been asked to come up with their vision for the mound and grass area outside from lot to Koenig.
- Scholarship awards were sent out to recipients
- Kuch Hall will be having a new look with fresh paint (different color). Marcel is the team leader for this
 project.
- Projects being discussed are the sidewalk replacement on our property that need it. A canopy (weather rated) that will be put up from Spring-Fall for outside worship area and will provide additional room for fundraising activities' needs to be in ADA compliance in that area by the doors. •A question was asked about a possible chancel space outside.
- Pew cushion project ongoing.
- Overview of the mound; plans call for plants that are low maintenance with a comprehensive grander plan of the future use of the space next to the parking lot. They will continue to work with the Environmental Committee on this plan.
- The Consistory officially named the outdoor mound, Mount Zion.
- Fundraising, Stewardship, and Outreach (John)
- Rummage sale meeting was held last week. It will be held November 9 from 9am-1 pm.
- They will be looking for volunteers to set up, sort and help the day of the event.
- There will be no meat raffle this year due to a scheduling conflict. It will be back next year.
- Stewardship Sunday will be November 17.
